Agenda Item 83: Crimes Against Humanity, at the Sixth Committee of the

Madam Chairperson,

At the outset, I would like to express our sincere appreciation to the International
Law Commission and the Special Rapporteur for crimes against humanity for their
extensive air

Not only now, the military committed crimes against humanity in the past including against Rohingya people in 2017.
