6. New Zealand has enacted legislation establishing jurisdiction in respect of the most serious international crimes. The Crimes of Torture Act 1989 (NZ) allows prosecution for acts of torture committed within or outside New Zealand, <sup>3</sup> provided the individual is located in New Zealand, is a New Zealand citizen, or the acts occurred in New Zealand.
