Turning now to the preambular paragraphs in line with Art. 53 of the Vienna Convention on the Law of the Treaties ee f ge e al international law (jus cogens) is a norm accepted and recognized by the international community of states as a whole as a norm from which no derogation is permitted and which can be modified only by a subsequent norm f ge e al i e a i al la ha i g he a e bha ab e N I he ILC b also the International Criminal Tribunal for the FearmYugoslavia and several regional human rights courts have stated that the prohibition of crimes against humanity constitutes jus cogens.

We concur with the ILC thathe definition of crimes against humanity as set forth

With regard to the preambulaparagraph on the duty of a state to exercise its criminal jurisdiction with respect to crimes against humanitye would like to reiterate our view that the convention does not require States to exercise universal jurisdiction

With regard to the scope of a future convention as state. Antificle 1 we would like to repeat our position that matters that may not be covered by convention would still by a large extent be regulated by customary international law.
