As the group for all developing countries, the promotion of the cause of the LDCs is at the heart of the group's endeavors. This is our duty! Accordingly, we pledge our solidarity with the plight of the LDCs for their sustainable development.
- 4. The Group also recognizes and appreciates the work of the Office of the High Representative (UN-OHRLLS) and continued coordination of the UN system contribution and support to the preparation of the Conference.
