That is why I have been advocating for deep structural changes to make global governance including the Bretton Woods system truly universal and more

But I know that change takes time. Which is why I have put forward concrete measures we can take right now, including an SDG Stimulus of at least \$500 billion per year.

Together with more contingency financing for countries in need, and a more effective debt workout mechanism, these measures would go a long way in ensuring you have the financing you need to weather and invest in sustainable development.
